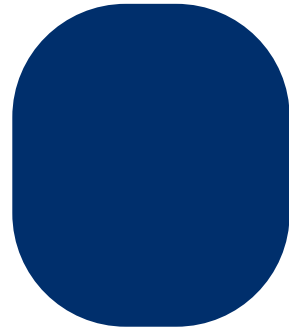

Letter from the Chairman

Choosing one's field of study is perhaps the most important decision in a young person's life. It is certainly one that can significantly impact their future satisfaction.

For this reason, the Agnelli Foundation has devoted increasing attention over the years to the topic of educational guidance. Its goal is to provide students, their families, and the entire school system with effective tools to facilitate this critical decision.

In 2023, we celebrated the first ten years of Eduscopio, a simple and effective tool that helps those deciding how to continue their education after middle school. For the past decade, our digital platform has provided objective and rigorous information to help users understand and compare the key features and qualities of high schools in their area. Specifically, it highlights how well these schools prepare students for university or the workforce. In this social report, we have gathered data illustrating the reach and popularity of Eduscopio, which has perhaps become the initiative most recognized by Italian families and the general public as a hallmark of the Agnelli Foundation.

The success of Eduscopio has encouraged us to reflect on the persistent need for additional resources for educational guidance.

While much has been done in recent years by educational institutions, we believe there is still room for deeper and more effective efforts. For this reason, on the tenth anniversary of Eduscopio, the Foundation launched a new project aimed at teachers. Teachers, who know their students well, are uniquely positioned to guide them toward paths that align with their interests and talents. This new initiative, also a completely free digital platform, is called FUtuRi. Its many resources enable teachers to uncover students' passions and predispositions through classroom activities, helping them discover their strengths and, via orientation-based learning activities, identify the most suitable educational paths for each individual.

We leave it to the curiosity of the readers of this social report to explore the other innovations of 2023. These include the launch

of two multi-year research programs: one on the quality of early childhood education services and the other on the potential of Artificial Intelligence in schools. Another noteworthy initiative is Matabì, an innovative educational project aimed at improving math learning from primary school by using colorful LEGO® bricks. Still focusing on the development of STEM skills (science, technology, and mathematics), 2023 also saw the launch of Hop, a project created in collaboration with CERN in Geneva and the National Institute of Nuclear Physics. This program guides middle school students through engaging and fun classroom experiments dedicated to physics and the scientific method.

This broad range of initiatives, employing diverse methods and approaches, shares a common and fundamental commitment: contributing to the improvement of schools and education in our country. Education is the most vital tool for empowering individuals to actively shape their future, become more aware of their strengths, and, above all, engage meaningfully in community life.

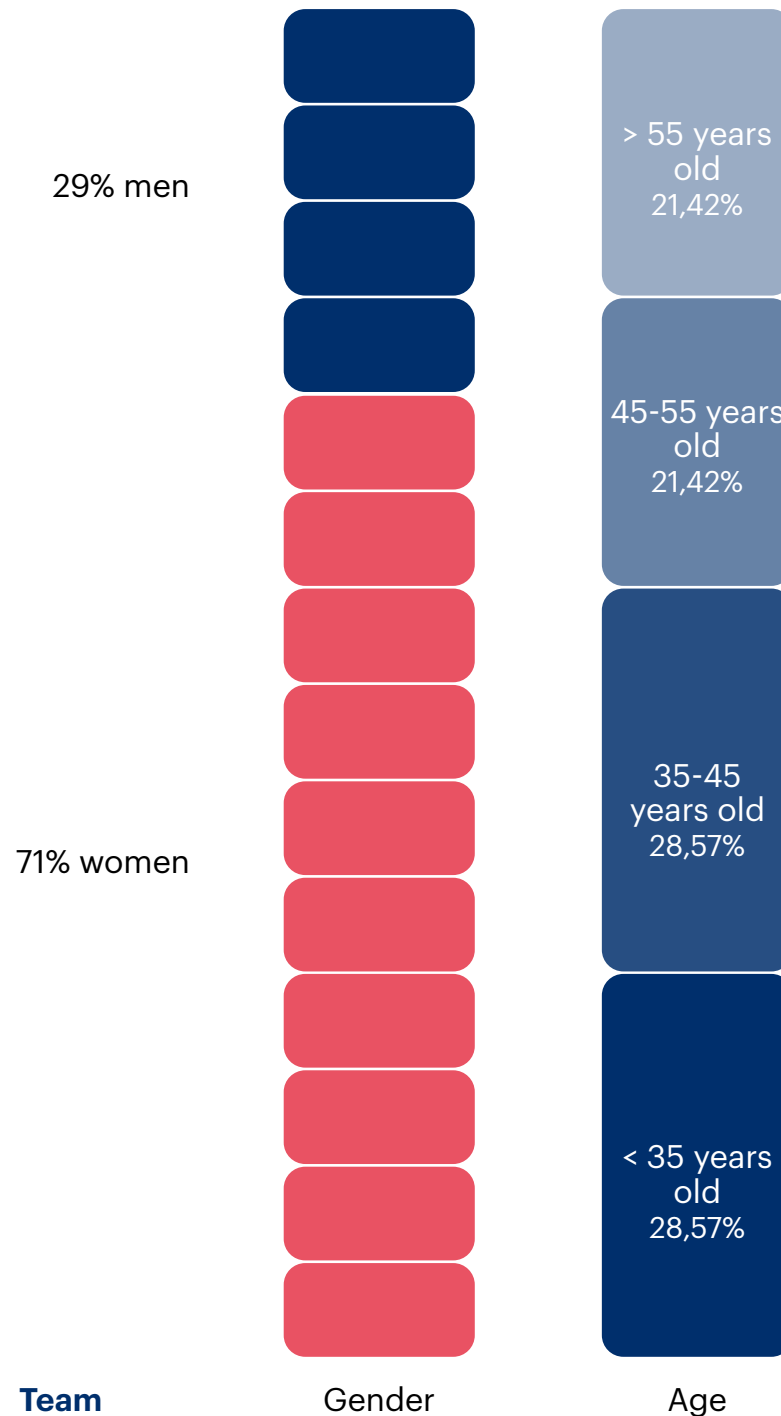

The committee is made up of three members (two nominated by the Board of Directors, ex art. 8, and one nominated by the Ministry of University and Research) and oversees the foundation's financial management. It avails itself of pro bono advisory from accounting firm EY. Since 2016, Fondazione Agnelli has defined an ethics code and a model for risk assessment, according to Italian law 231/01. The Risk Supervisory Committee is made up of the Audit Committee, which produces a specific quarterly report.

The Board of Directors, the Working Group and the Board of Auditors are updated to June 2023.

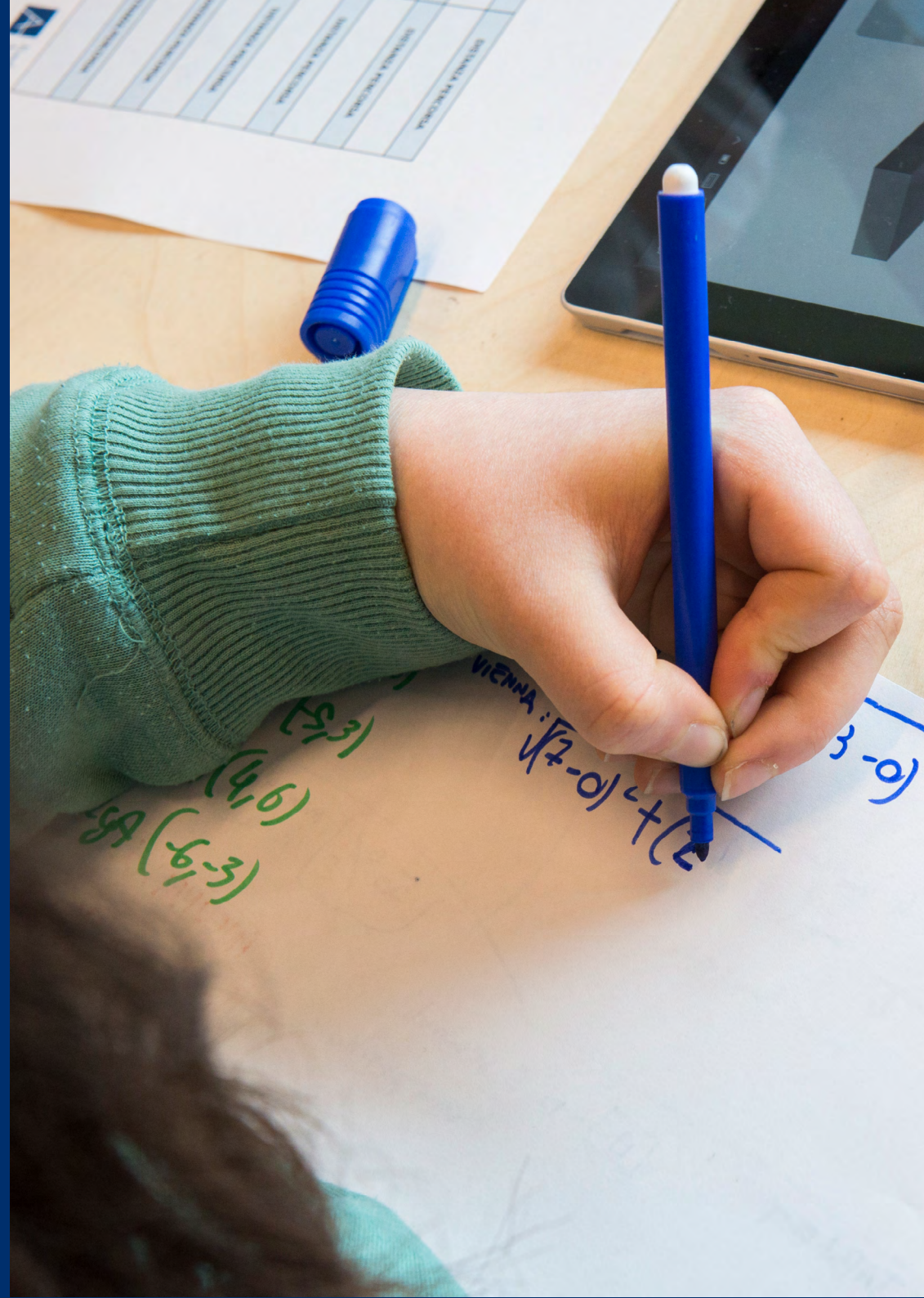

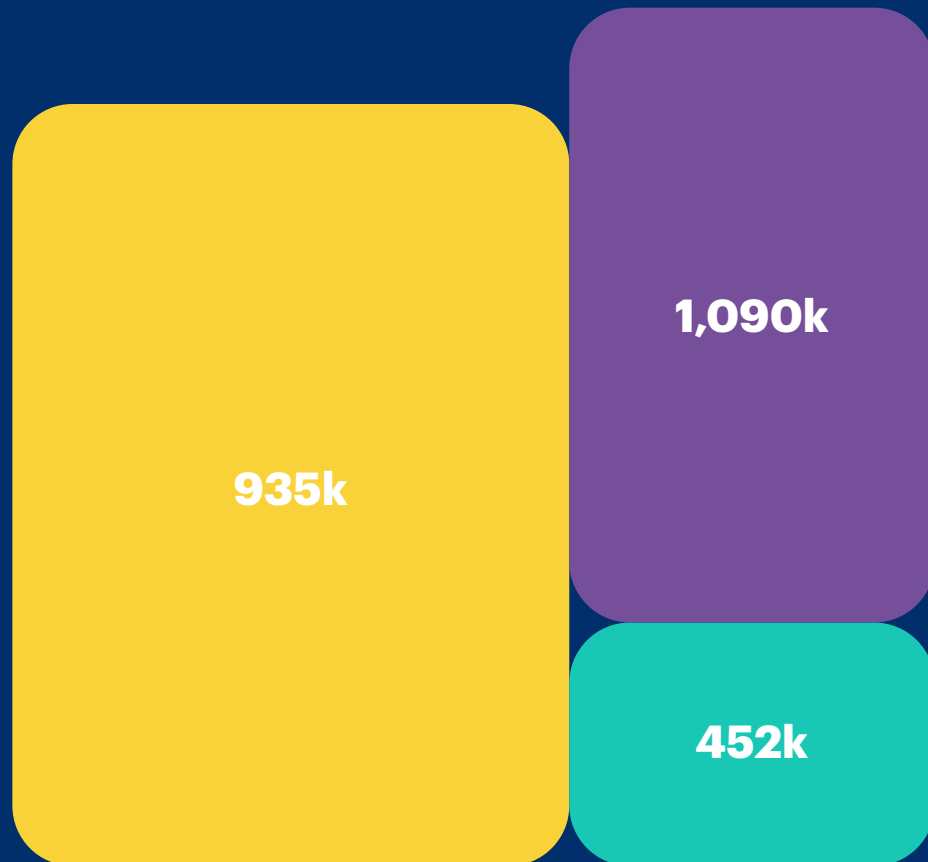

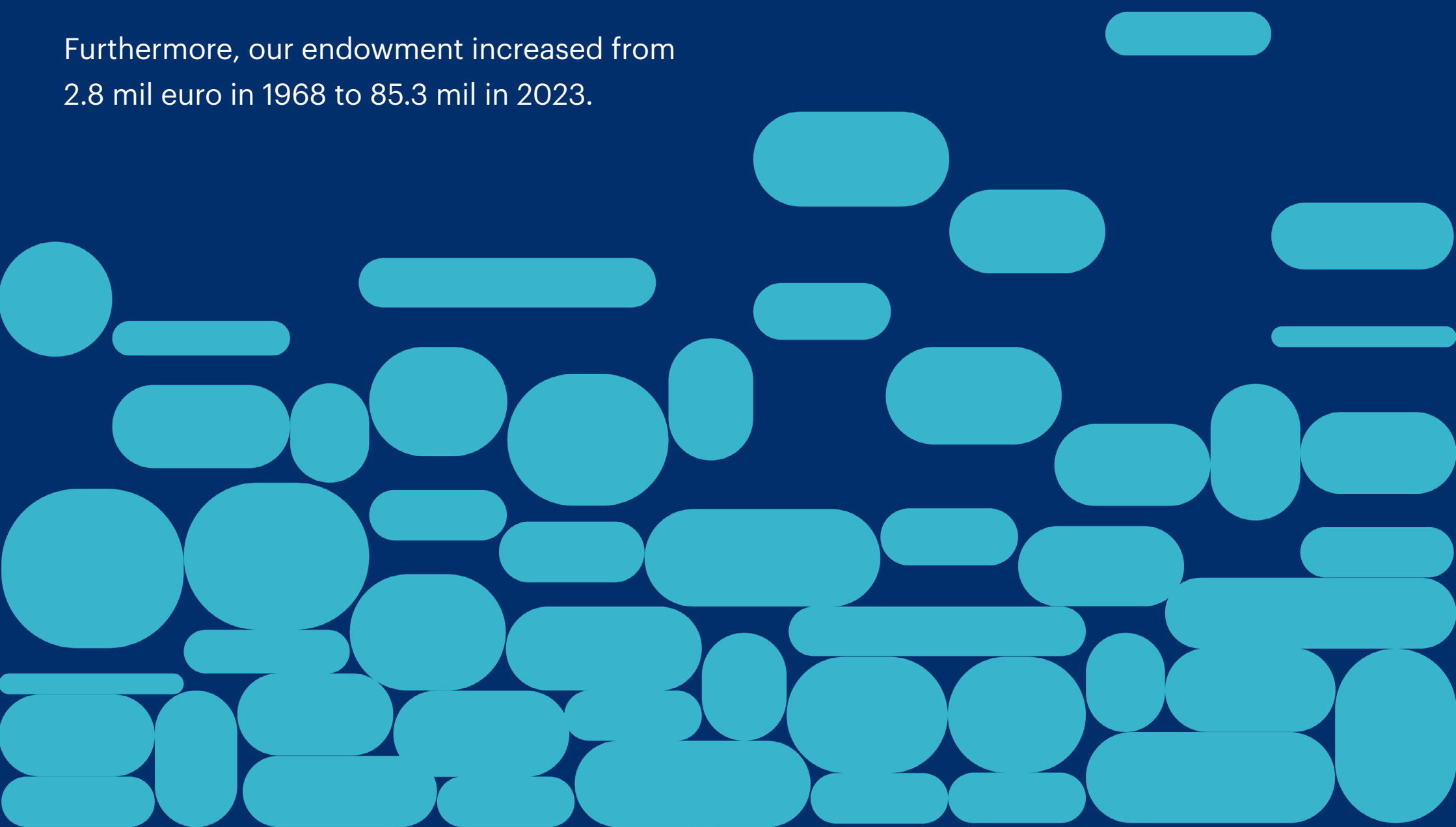

Teachers, after a training day, receive the kit containing materials on the scientific method, light, pressure and electric charge to experiment with their classrooms. The project is in collaboration with CERN and INFN, and support from Stellantis and Intesa San Paolo.
